WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION - 1st SEPTEMBER 2022



INTRODUCTORY REMARKS:

Pope Francis established 1 September as WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION, encouraging the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home.

This day of prayer is inspired by Pope Francis' landmark encyclical Laudato Si', which calls on "every person living on this planet" to care for our shared Earth.

⇒ "LISTEN TO THE VOICE OF CREATION" is the theme and invitation of this year's Season of Creation. In his message for the World Day of Prayer 2022, Pope Francis calls us to use this season to "cultivate our ecological conversion" and to pray together in "the great cathedral of Creation". He warns that we are reaching "a breaking point" and must act decisively so that "we and future generations can continue to rejoice in creation's sweet song of life and hope."

This *World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation* gives us the opportunity to reaffirm our personal vocation to be stewards of creation and to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which has been entrusted to our care.

May we implore God's help for the protection of creation as well as God's pardon for the devastation committed against the world in which we live.

"The annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation offers to individual believers and to the community a precious opportunity to renew our personal participation in this vocation as custodians of creation, raising to God our thanks for the marvellous works that He has entrusted to our care, invoking his help for the protection of creation and his mercy for the sins committed against the world in which we live." — Pope Francis

- Use the prayer resources provided
- o Speak to young children about the wonders of creation and our responsibility to turture and protect it.

\Rightarrow How to respond in PARISHES or GROUPS

- \circ $\,$ Celebrate Mass with a focus on the climate and care of creation
- o Get together with others to reflect on the themes of Laudato Si'
- Use the resources that have been provided here

If you cannot mark the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation itself, you could use these resources at any time during the Season of Creation (1 September – 4 October 2022).


GUIDED ROSARY FOR THE DAY OF PRAYER ON THE CARE OF CREATION

There are many ways we can look at the significant events in the life of Jesus, through the eyes of Mary, His Mother.

In this rosary we invite you to reflect on the Glorious Mysteries in the light of Pope Francis' Encyclical *"Laudato Si"*.

LUMINOUS MYSTERIES

FIRST MYSTERY: THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD



" At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love"". (Mc 1, 9-11)

Without water there is no life: the beauty of our planet would not be so awesome without this wonderful gift; without water there is no regeneration: man could not shine with the beauty of Christ, if through the water of baptism, he was not introduced into the very heart of the Trinitarian life. Few will be the efforts we will make to keep the water alive; so he can reach everyone; so that he can continue watering our fields and our forests, so that pure rivers flow down! And, without living water, there cannot be the living water of the Spirit in our hearts.

WATER – A PRECIOUS GIFT

In Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si*, water is mentioned 46 times. It is the precious gift of our sister, mother earth, through which we are refreshed. It is also useful for healthcare, agriculture, industry. And yet, also, it is in the earth's waters, as in the soil and the air, that we see the damage being done to the environment. There are also those who are excluded from access to clean water. Pope Francis says that access to drinkable water is a particularly fundamental human right. This is because it is a condition for exercising many other rights. He also questions the tendency to privatise water and turn it into a commodity. Can the availability of such a fundamental good be determined by price systems?

SECOND MYSTERY: THE WEDDING OF CANA



This mystery of the Rosary presents us with the story of a wedding feast – a committed relationship which the Church calls marriage, blessed and raised to a sacrament by Jesus, for the good of the couple and the procreation of children. Jesus did not begin His Public Ministry by some great work. At a household gathering in a little Galilean village, He worked His first miracle which added to the joy of a wedding feast. Thus, He saved the married couple from embarrassment and showed His desire to minister to their happiness.

All the wine had been served and Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine". Jesus replied:

"Woman, why do you involve me? My hour has not yet come". His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you". What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in Him". (Jn 2, 3-5.11)

WATER BECOMING WINE

The water that is transformed into wine at the Wedding Feast is a symbol of the joint effort between God and humanity. Wine is the combination of earth, grapes, water which are the natural products that God gives us and the creativity of people. And so that wine may never be lacking, God asks us to take care of our common home.

THIRD MYSTERY: THE PROCLAMATION OF THE KINGDOM



God's kingdom is a kingdom of justice and truth. In God's kingdom "He shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace" (LS 10).


"After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!" (Mc 1,14-15)

When Jesus sends out the 70 disciples, He makes it clear that they are on a mission of peace (Lk 10). They are to bring peace and healing to every house they enter. No wonder, then, that the disciples 'returned with joy'. Jesus warns them not to rejoice in the wonders and miracles they worked, but 'rejoice that your names are written in heaven'. Our true joy comes from *our own conversion* –

we were sinners, but we have been healed. We must become more like Mary, whose pure heart enabled her to play her part in the coming of the kingdom on earth.

The time has come to re-establish the original relationship between man and God, man and woman, man and nature, which sin destroyed leaving on earth injustice and greed, that the planet and its inhabitants have exploited since then. The call for a deep ecological conversion is an integral part of God's kingdom (cf. LS 217).

FORTH MYSTERY: THE TRANSFIGURATION



About a week after Jesus told His disciples plainly that He would suffer, be put to death, and be raised to life (Luke 9:22), He took Peter, James, and John up a mountain to pray. While praying, "the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning... A voice came from the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to Him'". (Lk 9, 29.35)

Moses and Elijah appeared and talked with Jesus about His death that would soon take place. Peter, not knowing what he was saying and being very fearful, offered to put up three shelters for them.

The Gospel of life and light and immortality shone among all of us as material light, of this world, in the form of an explosion that shone like the face of the Lord and that occurs at the beginning of the Lord's ascent to Jerusalem, where He goes to die on the cross. The white, sparkling light invites us to not forget that on our

path to conversion, we must be only guided by this light of resurrection, because this is a light of truth and life, we can be transfigured and change our face by Christ.

FIFTH MYSTERY: THE INSTITUTION OF THE EUCHARIST



"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take and eat; this is my body'. Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you. This is my blood'". (Mt 26, 26-27)

Christ is present in bread and wine. He Chose to use the basics of everyday food when He instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Why are most basic cereals for living at such high prices that most of the inhabitants of this planet are deprived of such basic food?

God's charity encourages us to work for justice and peace on earth, especially for all those in need.

It is our basic human right to have some form of bread that renews our strength. Today, most of us don't depend solely on bread. because we have many different kinds of food. But we still need food to live, whether bread or not, so food sustains life.

Laudato Si' was signed by Pope Francis on May 24, when the Church celebrates the Feast of Mary Help of Christians.

This is a beautiful opportunity for us to meditate on Mary as "the Mother and Queen of all creation." (Laudato Si', 241)
